## LEADERSHIP

### GOAL: SELF-GOVERNMENT BASED ON THE CULTURAL AND TRADITIONAL IDENTITY OF SIB.

- Starting back up in September -Cultural Liaison Teacher comes to centre daily to provide daycare and preschool children with culturally based lessons including Halq'émeylem language lessons, local plant/animal/medicine lessons, and more. K.McA. has commenced her role as Cultural Coordinator to bring cultural awareness and familiarity to the families we serve. These lessons can include Cultural Craft Lessons such as Bannock, beading, drumming, and drum making.
- Summer program implemented Cultural Exploration Tuesdays and included traditional crafts, medicines and more! Children had opportunities to create drums with an elder from our community and to create dreamcatchers.
- Include parents in newsletters incorporating SIB culture and language
- Meetings (virtual or in person) with staff, director, and elders to ensure inclusion.
- ➤ Newsletters/cultural calendar/ensure same messaging to all age groups/parents etc.
- More staff meetings (virtual or in person). Culturally based training for staff. Head Start at Seabird staff have taken training through Indigenous Canada (University of Alberta) including Early Years Indigenous Cultural Safety Resource training with podcasts. AIDP (along with SCD) attending Seasonal Planning and Cultural curriculum Workshop
- > Program planning for staff and meetings between staff and director/supervisors.
- Each program plans, in advance, for the coming months/year.
- Daycare/Head Start: working parents/no interest to date
- > Seabird Island Head Start program has been operating as a Head Start-At-Home program for Seabird, Shxw'owhamel, Cheam and Skwah. Weekly deliveries made to families with meals, program materials, and other items.
- Seabird Island ECD Department now has a Facebook page to post upcoming events, cultural awareness posts, and other posts directly related to childcare, child raising, behavioral awareness and more.
- AIDP supported several families with preschool registration. Increased visits with families with health and safety measures.
- > Supported Child Development Programs supported families with ASD assessment, helping with travel arrangements, payments of assessment.
- FVCDC Clinic days the first Tuesday of every month. CYMH Clinic days are 2nd Tuesday of every month.
- Families are attending joint visits with mental health, and child development. Caseloads are growing as people are seeking services more and more. There has been increased communication and collaboration with Sts'ailes.
- The hearing screening clinic in September went very well. Hearing screening is being complete and able to download the results onto the Biotech program. The Ey Qwal team have had time to develop their ability to both collaborate and delegate to deliver service that is family and child centered. SLA has learned very quickly is a talented and valued addition to the team.
