

# Seabird Island Health

Quarterly update
October 2021



- Health Administration
  - Five year evaluation being reviewed by Chief and Council
    - Evaluation, in other communities, is ongoing
  - Ten year Community Health Plan
    - Planning is underway
    - Call out for community participation August and Sept 2021
  - Accreditation renewal postponed
    - New date is January 2022



#### COVID update

- Approx 710 community members immunized
  - Roughly 70% vaccination rate
- Prior to our outbreak this fall, we had seven positive cases since the start of the pandemic
- Fall outbreak caused 72 cases, including several children. Four families currently isolating
- Both vaccinated and unvaccinated people got covid during the outbreak
- Four people went to hospital, none were fully vaccinated.
- 69 families were supported with food and/or accommodation through the Health teams



#### COVID update continued

- Testing available for people with high barriers to accessing testing through Fraser Health
- Rapid testing machine in the works
- Care kits for families on isolation
- Trailer for isolation available
- Health team liaise with Fraser Health and First Nations Health Authority to ensure all supports are in place for families with covid.



#### Income assistance

- Hiring for youth supported employment
- 114 open files
- Policy review ongoing

#### Traditional food bank

- Canning of salmon and mixed veggies
- Dehydrating food for soups, oatmeal and traditional teas (2 new large dehydrators)
- Average of 10 families supported each month












- Employment and Training
  - Career counselling
    - 90 clients monthly
  - Employment readiness
    - 300 monthly visits with clients













- Health promotion
  - Community kitchen going strong
    - 35-45 bags delivered to Seabird participants each month







- Community gym/mobility program
  - Twice a week service from physio/kinesiology
  - 6-8 clients from Seabird; home visits

#### Fall and winter

- Light Yard work
- Friendly visiting
- Minor home repairs
- Snow shoveling
- Wood chopping/stacking





#### Medical clinic

- 2 First Nations doctors
- Over 3800 patients
  - 60 -70% telephone visits
- Obstetrician will be resuming later in the fall
- Nurse practitioner joining soon!

#### **Patient profile**

- 261 Asthma
- 16 Liver Failure
- 36 Kidney Failure
- 19 Congestive Heart Failure
- 33 other Heart problems
- 28 Rheumatoid Arthritis
- 9 Cancer







- Dental clinic
  - 2500 clients
  - Running at about 70%
  - New part time dentist
  - Excellence in covid protocols





- Child and Family Services: Capital project
  - Create office space, meeting rooms, and program spaces for Child and Family services
  - \$3,000,000 retroactive amount provided by Indigenous services Canada for Child Protection Prevention work
  - Hope to co-locate these spaces with cultural programs/youth programs/elder programs



- Family development
  - Seven workers providing intensive and ongoing support for Seabird families (161 clients)
    - Cultural support
    - Food and basic needs
    - Life skills
    - Youth connections
    - Women's group (summer)
    - Men's group (summer)













#### Child protection

- Monthly case management meetings with MCFD
- Monthly case management meetings with Xyolhemeylh
- Monthly strategic planning for Seabird jurisdiction over child protection
- Maggie Pettis: Child advocate/Band Rep
- Statistics
  - Children in care: 4 off reserve children
  - Youth agreements: 3 on reserve and 2 special needs agreements off reserve
  - Extended family program: 11 families on reserve; 5 off reserve
  - Service files: 8 families being helped by MCFD on reserve



- Child protection
  - Preparation for Seabird jurisdiction over child protection
  - \$250,000 grant for preparation work
    - Three year plan; year one is funded
    - Thorough community consultation
    - Research laws and models of service
    - Create laws, policies, procedures
    - Increase community capacity for service delivery




#### Mental Health

- Recovery Homes
  - Decreased capacity for Covid protocols
  - Averaging 8 clients per home



- Four families have a stable and safe place to grow
- UFV student placement agreement
  - Social work program
  - Teaching clinic; 4 students quarterly
  - Many students are hired!







#### Land based trauma healing house

- Agassiz house purchased for long term investment
- Agassiz house is used for this program
- \$400,000 for operating costs
- Intensive, group-based, trauma healing
- Cultural and on the Land/territory
- Cohorts starting fall 2021












- Elders Program
- Adapted programming for covid
  - Consultations and phone calls
    - New Seabird Sq'ewqel Logo—for input
    - Bear hunting video
    - Restorative justice groups
    - Elders newsletter and Land Use Survey
    - August 24<sup>th</sup> Sq'ewqel Gathering



- Elders Grants for 2021- 2022
  - New Horizons elders genealogy project
    - Family trees for Elders



- New relationship trust
  - Honoraria to facilitate Elder work on committees



#### Elders

- Fraser Health initiative for improving elders mobility
  - Seabird activity coordinator provides programming for elders in our catchment
  - Funding is available for schooling: coordinator is enrolled
    - Stenberg College for the Therapeutic Recreation (gerontology specialization)
  - Connections and support from Fraser Health coordinator



- Youth programs: Youth led and Youth staff
  - School's Out (6 -12 year olds)
    - 2 year funding
    - Mill Hall
    - 9 youth; 55-65 per month
  - Drop in for older youth continues (covid context)
    - 10 youth; 60-70 drop-ins per month
    - Many kids staying at home





- Youth programs: Youth led and Youth staff
  - Outreach
    - Peer mentors 1:1
    - clients served: 22/month
    - contacts made in person: 29/month
    - contacts through text, call or message:107/month

#### - Youth mental health

- Counselling
- clients served: 14/month
- 1:1 sessions: 24/month; group sessions (humpday hangout): 3 (monthly)
- contacts through text, call or message: 77/month
- · referrals made: 1/month
- Advocacy meetings (school, social worker etc): 4/month





- Skateboard initiative with family development
  - Outreach to the skateboard park
  - Plan to purchase for skateboard park equipment at Seabird
