

Hicks Creek And Spawning Habitat

- a. Off reserve driveway was dug up to relieve flooding pressure on farms upstream
- b. The quick release of this water pressure has caused unmeasured damage to roadways and other infrastructure on Reserve (studies are currently being conducted).
- c. Small bridges or 6'x6' culvert blocks are needed to ensure safety and safe water flow during peak periods

- Developing a Framework Process to address the remaining 25%

Speed dating type of arrangement, 20 min each Minister.



- Promote all habitat restoration projects

Natural Resources

- Hired a Natural Resource Program Officer
- She is a supporting technician to portfolio holders on the Aboriginal Rights & Title
- Working on the Strength of Claim
- Work directly with the Referrals department and support Lands department
- Will review and make recommendations on all federal and provincial policy changes

Lands

Committee:

- Four individual terms expired for the Lands Committee Members
- Posting was sent out
- The Elders position, Wayne Bobb, was renewed
- Two new members were appointed,
 June Harris and Megan Louis
- One position is still vacant

Land Use Plan:

- Updating the Land Use Plan
- Request for proposals was sent out
- Watch for meeting dates for input in the upcoming months

Traditional Land Holdings:

- There have been a series of interviews with members
- Work on family trees
- Historical land information was gathered
- Program has been extended
- Watch for new interview dates
