Health Administration

- New Child and Family Service Program Manager and new Child Protection Manager have been hired
- We are in the process of creating and formulating the 10-year community health plan
- Accreditation renewal, doing working groups, gathering documents and strategies
- We have had practicum students from social work program, dental, and doctors. They are working with our staff from a range of a few week to a few months, depending on their program.
- New process for funerals is being reviewed.
- There have been 54 covid cases in Seabird for January; 25 in February and 17 for March



Doctors and Dental Offices

- Dental team went to the annual dental conference in Vancouver
- Dentist office back to regular capacity with the weather clearing up
- Keeping some covid protocols in place for patient safety
- A Nurse Practitioner will be working under Dr. Fox in the near future

Health Support Services

- Employment and Pre-Employment going strong with their career counselling, and training plans
- Income assistance assisted with 7 funerals this quarter and have closed files due to clients moving and finding work.
- The Income Assistance First Nations Youth Employment program has been a success with 2 jobs being offered to our IA clients.
- Traditional food bank supported 26 families this quarter
- Driver Education will be starting again very soon as a community member has successfully completed her ICBC driving course.



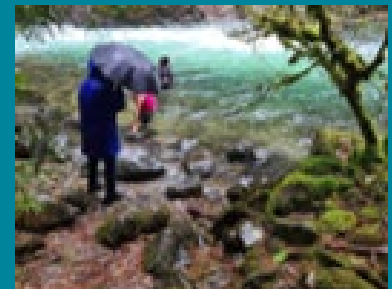
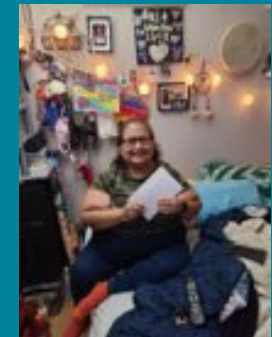


Child and Family Services

- National crime prevention grant ceremony was held this March
- New furniture and generators were purchased for the Trauma centre, Recovery Homes, and the Family home
- The Justice Program is being reviewed and established again.
- Indigenous Trauma Resiliency Informed Practice training has been provided to the team
- Collaboration with school district 78 for at risk students has been in process
- Developing a new program specific to sexualized violence rapid response
- We have expanded our Youth program with more workers, activities, and outreach.
- Trauma centre has completed 2 men's groups, 1 female, a family group and are planning to do a couples group

Health Services

- Better at homes has a new worker and has been doing re-evaluations of clients for this new fiscal year
- The Elder's Program is growing
- Elder's program running in person and with tablets purchased for the Elders. They are exercising, doing crafts, and working on a genealogy project in the elder's lounge
- The Nurses were invited to the annual nurses gathering in Harrison to be honored by FNHA
- MCH has had an increase in attendance and participation.
- Nutrition is doing virtual workshops for nutrition education, cooked meals for family who have had losses. Providing food safe classes, and reviewing videos regarding canning and food preparations
- Mobile diabetes team is servicing other communities again
- School visits started again and immunizations have been provided





Child Protection

- Preparation for Seabird jurisdiction over child protection: Year 1
- A Child Protection Program Manager has been hired and we are in the process of hiring a Child protection supervisor, and program coordinator
- Meeting with Matriarchs and Patriarchs of Seabird to develop a Child Protection program fit for Seabird
- We have completed 3 Matriarch meetings and 2 Patriarch meetings
- We have been meeting with other communities about their progress in taking over jurisdiction
- Completing research on different aspects of child protection and what is needed



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
