

Seabird Island Dental Clinic

- Seabird Island Dental Clinic provides all your basic dental care, including cancer screening and minimum sedation services.
- Even with the pandemic behind us we want to assure you that we are still following universal precautions and practicing optimal infection control to be able to provide the best care to our patients. Masks, for the time being, are still required in the dental office and our operatories have an air filtration unit to reduce the spread of airborne contaminates. The dental team is up to date with all required vaccinations.
- The dental team is continuing our professional development by taking courses that expand our knowledge in the dental world as well as in the community that we serve. This year we attended the Grade 6 career Fair and the Seabird Health Fair in July. We also regularly attended the monthly Parent and Tot groups as well as Someone So Small. We have a Cavity Prevention Program that will escort Elementary school students to our office for their checkups.
- We are going to work hard to encourage patients that haven't been in a while to come in for checkup. Oral Health goes hand in hand with overall wellness. We are also going to look for more feedback from our existing patients on ways for us to improve and remove barriers that maybe holding patients back from seeing us regularly.

Mobile Diabetes Program

- Vision Technician Andrew Duerkson has moved on from his position. As many First Nation's Communities have access to local optometry supports it was felt that the Mobile Diabetes Team would add an Annual Foot Exam to their list of services replacing eye exams in the process.
- Pamela Kalia, LPN CDE was successful in obtaining her Certified Diabetes Educator designation and joined the team Full-Time.
- Dann Swann, Diabetes Educator has reduced his travel with the team but continues to support local initiatives and team members as needed.
- Dr Benjamin Schroeder, Endocrinologist has now taken over for Dr Dawson
- MDT was able to upgrade our aging equipment. We now have 4 DCAs and 2 new Piccols that have been tested by CEQUAL's Lab for Quality control.
- When the team is on the road the goal is to increase access to the communities' members by offering workshops to their health care providers, families through workshops, dinner presentations and one to one education sessions and offer screening to all community's members who are at risk of developing diabetes.
- Unfortunately, the Team has been struggling to meet the demands of the community's requests for clinics due to staffing. At the present time we have only 2 staff members that travel 3/4 week of the month.

Public Health and Screening - Immunization/Communicable Disease

We are doing excellent with our Infant and childhood immunizations rates in Seabird Island when compared to rates in Fraser Health! In addition to providing immunizations to clients of all ages in our community, our Public Health Nurses also provide other services which include TB testing, Sexually Transmitted Infections screening, PAP HPV testing, Birth control support and provision, condom distribution and school health (which includes: immunizations, teaching, weekly youth drop-in clinic).

Mental Health & Family Wellness Program

Staffing Updates:

We hired 2 new Family Development Workers, a Life Skills Coach at the Family Homes, and another full-time counsellor to complete the clinical team. We currently are posting for Supervisor of Family Development Program as the previous supervisor took over as Program Manager of Families and Wellness.

Events, meetings, workshops, you participated in:

Program Updates:

- ► A:yxalh Family Homes have been at full capacity since October 2023.
- A:yelexw Recovery Homes are currently undergoing a process of strategic organizational change and will recommence intaking new clients in May 2024. We are reviewing all the policy and procedures, hiring all new staff and supervisor, and negotiating with funders for increased financial support. The program will be more effective and efficient, with our goal being to increase the number of successful graduates while remaining well withing our operational budget.
- ▶ Family Development: The 2 newest workers hit the pavement running. They have been providing much needed support to our families. They are organizing a series of Naloxone training sessions for staff, community members and youth-specific sessions at SI school. They commenced distribution of Naloxone kits and safe use supplies door-to-door. The goal is to prevent unnecessary overdose deaths due to toxic drug distribution. Family Development hosted 2 events for National Addictions Awareness Week (NAAW), recommenced the monthly shopping bus into Chilliwack, hosted weekly Men's and Women's support groups and outings to activities such as Corn Maze, Whitecaps Soccer
- ▶ Counselling: The team now comprised of 4 staff members, offers a variety of support to Seabird community including play therapy, youth counselling, drug and alcohol counselling, LGBTQIA2S+ counselling, support groups, and Forest Therapy sessions. As well, there is family and individual counselling to help with issues such as trauma, grief, loss, anxiety, and depression.
